

SINGLE ORIGIN

It has flavour hints of stoned-fruit acidity at first that develops onto a malty bran flakes with a caramel sweetness to it. A very satisfying cup with a medium amount of body and a persistent long-lasting finish. Adding milk brings some toffee notes to the fore.

Asprotimana was born 13 years ago when 38 coffee growers from Timana who were suffering from the coffee crisis came together, and sought to have a better quality of life protected by the culture of legality. This association of producers since its inception has managed to leave high the hardworking and unbreakable spirit of the coffee growers of Huila. Today it has 850 members in the municipalities of Timaná, Suaza, Elías, Tarquí, and Pitalito in the department of Huila, and produces some of the best quality coffees.

The support provided to Asprotimana has focused mainly on technical assistance to achieve the different certifications in more than 200 coffee farms; resources to create a rotary fund for the purchase of green coffee; resources to finance part of the laboratory equipment where the quality and cupping tests are carried out, as well as for the collection center and for the accompaniment of the Manager and other associates at international coffee fairs in Dublin, Costa Rica, etc., in order to acquire the necessary skills to negotiate coffee in international markets.

Asprotimana plans to continue growing, building a Coffee Development Center in the Department of Huila where a drying center, a roasting plant, and its collection center and administrative headquarters will be expanded, in turn marking the integral development of the community. It has become a clear reference for other associations of agricultural producers.
